APPLICATION FOR A CONSOLIDATED PERMIT/REGISTRATION UNIFIED HAZARDOUS MATERIALS / HAZARDOUS WASTE MANAGEMENT REGULATORY PROGRAM

INSTRUCTIONS

Read the following instructions before completing this application form.

Type of Application: Indicate by checking the appropriate box if this application is a first time (*initial*) application, a *modification* to an existing permit/registration, or a *renewal* of an expired or expiring permit/registration.

1. Facility Information

Write the name of the business and its location. Provide the street address, Zip Code, phone number and contact email.

Please do not list P. O. Box addresses.

2. Hazardous Materials Storage Program

In the spaces provided enter total quantity of hazardous materials stored or used at the business. Liquids are reported in *gallons*; solids are reported in *pounds*; and gases are reported in *cubic feet at standard temperature and pressure* (STP, or 32°F temperature and 14.7 psi – pounds per square inch – pressure). If you have radioactive materials quantities are reported in curies.

Also provide the total number of hazardous classes for the hazardous materials. These can be found on each chemical Safety Data Sheet (SDS). Examples of hazard categories are: Combustible Liquid, Flammable Liquid, Oxidizer, Corrosive, Irritant, Other Health Hazard, Toxic, Highly Toxic, Oxidizing Gas, Flammable Gas, Compressed Gases, Radioactive, etc.

Finally indicate if any material is listed under the Federal 40CFR355 extremely hazardous substances (EHS).

3. Accidental Release Prevention Program

These are substances that have been listed by the State or Federal Government that have the potential for off-site consequences and have threshold quantities (TQ) over identified levels by those agencies. Common examples of these include: Anhydrous Ammonia Gas (TQ – 500 pounds), Chlorine Gas (TQ-100 pounds), Hydrogen Gas (10,000 pounds), Nitric Acid (TQ-1000 pounds) and Sulfuric Acid (TQ-1000 pounds). Check the YES box only if the quantity of the regulated substance you handle is equal to or greater than the listed threshold quantity (TQ).

4. Underground Storage Tank Program

If you store hazardous materials or hazardous waste in underground storage tanks (USTs), you are subject to additional federal, state and local regulations. State laws distinguish between USTs used to store (motor-vehicle) fuel or other petroleum products (gasoline, diesel, jet fuel, new motor oil) and USTs used to store other hazardous substances (non-petroleum solvents such as alcohols, and non-fuels like waste oil and other hazardous wastes). If yes identify the number of tanks. Also indicate the material contained in, and the capacity in gallons of each tank.

5. Aboveground Storage Tank Program

If you have aboveground storage of petroleum products in 55 gallon drums or greater with an aggregate total for the facility of 1,320 gallons or greater, then you are required to prepare a Spill Prevention, Control, and Countermeasure Plan (SPCC).

6. Hazardous Waste Generator Program

If you generate hazardous waste (including waste oil) from your operations in this facility, indicate the average quantity you generate per month (include all hazardous wastes). Specify whether the quantity is in *gallons* or *pounds*. Indicate also if you collect hazardous wastes from remote sites and consolidate them at this facility.

7. Recycling

If you recycle (i.e. re-use after minor treatment) your own hazardous waste in this facility, you are an onsite recycler. If you recycle other facility's waste after bringing it into your facility, you are an off-site recycler.

8. Tiered Permit Program

If you treat your own hazardous waste in this facility, you are subject to federal and/or state requirements. The Hayward Fire Department, as CUPA, issues a "tiered permit" for on-site treatment of hazardous waste. Indicate the number of permitted treatment units you have on site, under each tier named in the application. If you treat hazardous waste without a tiered permit, notify the Fire Department promptly for guidance on how to obtain a tiered permit.

Certification and Signature

Read the certification statement and sign your application. Print your name and title and write the date you signed the application.
