1. Call to order at 6:31 by Chairman Lara Cruz.

4. Approval of Minutes from: Commissioner Mendoza approves the minutes, and Lilybeth seconds that motion.
5. Public Comments: None.
6. Guest Speakers: Austin, Transit Planner from AC Transit - Plans the schedules for stops running through Hayward. Estee, a community government affairs, also in attendance. They both work on and help citizens who need help/have suggestions with AC Transit. They both work on Plan|ACT, which has new proposals and changes for how AC Transit is run/which stops are where, etc. Plan|ACT is in the middle of their changes which have started in Fall of 2014.

AC Transit Survey meeting

A representative from AC Transit, Estee Sepulveda, shares some recent findings about Alameda County's preferences in the transportation system. Some questions asked are listed below:

- 1) I prefer to wait less, but walk faster. 81% said
 - a) AC Transit is trying to consolidate the bus stops in order to increase the time efficiency.
- 2) Should we have more transfer points on the bus system, or should the routes be more direct? Does everyone collect at a central point and then catch multiple points from there, or do you like direct routes?
 - a) Split in between. 55% liked the transfer option (with a meeting spot, like at Hayward BART). AC Transit will be shortening the lines in order to increase the frequency. The plan will increase the level of service frequency using more direct routes and reducing the "extraneous" stops. Plan will begin in June 2016
- 3) Extended 5, 15, and 30 minute routes. Reduced the 60 minute routes. AC Transit will be cutting back the 60 minute routes and reapplying those resources into other lines. It will do this by cutting certain sections out of the route.
- 4) 100 new buses will be bought, all made in Hayward! More local hiring
- 5) When a certain portion of the bus route is delayed, the new system will ensure that this delay will not affect the other buses

The representatives offer to visit and present at HYC members schools or hosting a small group of shadow visits for students to learn more about career opportunities at AC Transit

- b. La Vista Residential Park-David Rizk, director of development service, communicates the city's plan for the construction of a new residential park with HYC. This park will extend through the hills near Industrial Road in close proximity to Tennyson, and also near a maintenance road in a residential district. City Council would like to expand the park and want to acquire some nearby land. The park will feature raised elevations, spectacular views, and be located near cattle/horse stables. There will be also be a water detention system to retain water during the drought. The total estimated price for this endeavor is at least \$10 million. Rizk asks HYC members to rate their choices for this new park, and members are asked to select their favorite features of the new park.

 - Survey Group: The group is still receiving responses and the **deadline for turning in surveys will be mid-March**. Additionally, the group is trying to get into contact with students at King Middle School to distribute surveys at that location.
