DECISION MAKING STRUCTURE

*Decide on decision making & voting
structure*

DECISION MAKING/ VOTING OPTIONS

- **Majority Vote** - Whichever option receives the most votes
- **2/3rds Vote** - At least 2/3rds of the committee must vote yes in order to move forward with a decision (7 members out of 11 voting members)
- **Consensus** - Everyone must agree in order to move forward with a decision

Note: Alternates are non-voting members, however, they will attend every meeting so that they are informed about what is happening and will be able to vote if someone on the committee needs to drop out.

QUORUM

- **How many should quorum be?**
- **Quorum = The minimum amount of people that needs to be there to make a vote**
- **Previous discussion with the community = 9**
