Council-Transit Battle Looms

UNION CITY — City councilmen will decide Feb. 14 whether they will formally battle the gigantic Bay Area Rapid Transit District in an effort to have the transit line depressed through Union City. In a meeting last week — termed an informal work session — councilmen considered the problem and generally agreed they would prefer to see the line depressed, rather than elevated, through most of Union City. The rapid transit district favors an elevated line — one which could be as high as 35 feet over the Western Pacific Railroad tracks. In the area where the proposed elevated line will cross the tracks, there is a large residential area which would lose its view of the scenic hills, according to City Planning Director Donald Brunnett. Brunnett maintains that the costs of a depressed — or below ground level — route is about the same as an elevated line.

No Pink Elephants, Just Reds

SAN LEANDRO — It was a precarious perch for Heinrich J. Frischkorn as he sat in his car early this morning suspended menacingly 100 feet above San Leandro Creek. Frischkorn, 27, of 824 Davis St., San Leandro, was attempting a turn from East 14th Street onto Hays Street when his vehicle swung out wide, tore through a chain link fence, and came to rest hanging over the creek. Frischkorn, with the last third clinging tenaciously to a concrete retaining wall.

"HE CLIMBED to safety on the driver's side," a police spokesman said. "If he'd climbed on the other side he'd have been done for." Frischkorn, who was uninjured, told police he was run off the road by some persons he thought were Communists. He walked home after the crash to a spot in an effort to improve his condition. He was arrested for drunkenness.

Russell City Service Area Superfluous?

Dissolution of the Russell City Community Services District, pending redevelopment of the Russell area, is being recommended by the Board of Supervisors by County Administrator Earl Strathman. Strathman said a state-estimated cost of \$1.5 million set of 1965 provides the machinery for dissolution by the board. The board has already taken action to dissolve the Killare Woods Community Services District, which has accepted the rural Pleasanton township community, and will be dissolving several other purposeless districts shortly, the administrator said.
