### ANOTHER LETTER TO BARTELL

Complying with the request of Mr. Percy Bartell, in a letter dated Aug. 28, 1950, Chairman Paul G. Willits of the Eden Council for Civic Unity Tuesday sent a copy of his letter concerning the Russell City water supply to the Alameda county board of supervisors.

With the supervisors scheduled to convene on Thursday, Willits stated, "Although Mr. Bartell requested that a copy of the letter of June 24 be addressed to his personally, I am taking the liberty of again bringing it to your attention with a plea for an official reply."

Willits' second letter to the supervisors on Aug. 10 requested a definite answer to his communication questioning when a new water main to Russell City will be completed.

Last week Bartell answered Willits' inquiry by stating that "the letter had been referred to Supervisor George Jameson for his opinion and could be found therein." He declared that if Willits would "have any further letter addressed to me personally, I will see that you get an answer."

### House Votes Draft Bill For Doctors

WASHINGTON (UP)—The House approved Wednesday a bill to draft doctors, dentists and allied specialists through age 50 for 21 months military service.

The bill is aimed mainly at providing service as estimated 5000 doctors and dentists who go all or part of their training in uniform and government employment during World War II but who put in little or no active service.

### Port, Air Field Saved Temporarily

TOKYO, Thursday (UP)—American and South Korean defenders have saved Pohang and its airfield from a Communist attack temporarily.

The Yanks and their South Korean allies, supported by tanks and with marine help, planes having a five-day lull, mopped up a four-hour attack late yesterday afternoon by clearing the enemy from a ridge overlooking the main Pohang-Taejeon highway. That cut a lifeline for supplies and reinforcements.

Only snipers are now left on the ridge.

Gen. Douglas MacArthur's midnight communication said that the North Korean forces reported earlier in the day had been driven from hills in the area, the main road southwest of Pohang reported cut by an enemy patrol earlier in the day has been cut.

It was a heartening victory for outnumbered American and South Korean troops who for four days have battled some 25,000 Communists attempting to take the port of Pohang and its airfield.

MacArthur's communication said that some 35,000 U.S. troops and 200 had infiltrated over hills, but that units of the South Korean division were in contact with them.
