SIGNIFICANT INCIDENTS

ROBBERY: On 12/29/2024 at 07:00 AM, the adult female victim was near a bus stop near the 27000 block of Tyrell Ave when 2 adult male subjects, approached her from behind and assaulted her with a weapon.
